Pastoral Letter

Dear Church Family and Friends,

As you read this, we are well into our fall season of heightened church activities. By the time you receive this newsletter, Oktoberfest will be completed, World Communion Sunday will be celebrated, and our Stewardship Campaign will be well underway. Before long, our Thanksgiving celebrations will be here.

So many people are contributing to the vitality of our communal life here at St. Luke's and as I reflect on this my heart swells in gratitude. You give of yourselves so that others may know the presence of Christ. You give of yourselves so that ministry can flourish here in Jeffersonville.

Stewardship—yes, this word has to do with the financial health of any organization, but it is so much more than that. A steward is one who looks after the resources of an entity, making sure that the resources are well used. All of us at St. Luke's are the stewards of our resources.

Here are some ways that you are providing stewardship at St. Luke's:

- 1. Our Young Adult Mission and Ministry group meets weekly to consider God's word and to plan ways to contribute to the congregation. As they read Rev. Dr. Patricia Tull's book, *Inhabiting Eden*, this fall they will be envisioning ways that St. Luke's can more effectively care for our Earth.

- 6. You made possible our beautiful sanctuary renovation!
- 7. You support a staff that works diligently to provide worship opportunities, pastoral care, Christian education, church administration, custodial care, and financial oversight.



Because of **YOU**, St. Luke's changes lives. Thank you for the time, talent, and money that you give to accomplish this. First, I hope St. Luke's has helped you on your Christian journey. Maybe it was a certain pastor, church camp, a Sunday school teacher, or some special spiritual moment at St. Luke's that you remember that has helped you on life's journey. **YOUR** generosity to Center for Lay Ministries, Loaves and Fishes, Narcotics Anonymous, Boy Scouts, American Cancer Society, Our World Christian Mission, etc. also helps make it possible for St. Luke's to change lives.

For the last few difficult years, St. Luke's has spent more than we have received. Thank God that we have had some savings to fall back on. **BUT** we cannot continue to do that and survive. To pay the bills and have a vibrant program, the Finance and Property team feels we need to have \$170,000 in giving. The Bible gives us a standard of 10%. And if every member gave 10%, we would have much more given than the \$170,000. If you do the math, each member's goal to reach \$170,000 would be \$1260 a year or a little over \$100 per month, about \$25 a week, and only about \$3.50 a day. And if 10% sounds way out of line, I ask you what percentage tip do you leave? :-)

Here at St. Luke's, thank God some give more than \$1260 a year. And we do not want you to cut back. No matter how much you give, "You are welcome here." If you are giving less than 10% or less than \$1260 per year, please prayerfully consider increasing your giving.

We are encouraging every member to complete a giving card and a time and talent sheet to help us be a vibrant church doing the work of Jesus Christ. The Pony Express is our main method of reaching every member. In the bag is a letter with your name on it. Please, in a timely fashion (two days), complete the information, call, and deliver the bag to the next person on the list. When the list is complete or if you have difficulty passing the bag along, call the listed Station Agent.

Thank you for any and all of your past contributions of time, talent, or money. St. Luke's has been changing lives for over 160 years. Our previous members have left us a beautiful church. Let's not only keep it open with the lights on. Let's keep it alive and thriving.
