Pastor's Letter

Greetings to you all in the name of our Teacher, Savior and Word, Jesus Christ. I am so grateful for each and every one of you at St. Luke's. A little over three months into my time here, I am getting to know more of you and I am thoroughly enjoying participating in the life of the church.

In many ways, I experienced myself being lifted in the Spirited whirlwind of beginning with you in the Lent and Easter Season, resuming in-person worship and the slight disorientation that comes with participating in a new environment. But the whirlwind has set me down gently and I am glad to find myself at home here at St. Luke's.

As summer approaches, there are so many good things happening here that I can't begin to describe them fully. To name a few:

- We have resumed our children's ministry with Family Music Night and on June 6 we will be offering Children's Church during worship. Our campers are getting ready to attend Faith Journeys camp at Merom Camp in mid-June. And in July we will hold Vacation Bible School for children. Our theme this year is Discovery at Adventure Island. Look for more on this elsewhere in the newsletter.
- Our mission and evangelism committee is developing an outreach plan for young adults and we hope to offer young adult worship time this summer.
- A feasibility work group is being formed to look at our use of the side-lot and bring recommendations to the council.
- The Elders are meeting and providing pastoral support to me and to those in need in our congregation.
- Leaders have stepped forward to attend to the Spiritual Life components of worship and prayer.
- And a blessing indeed, we received a \$1075 sustainability grant from the Indiana-Kentucky Conference to fund our Vacation Bible School and resumption of Bible Study/Sunday School for both adults and children.
- June 3-5 in our Indiana-Kentucky Annual Gathering and July 11-18 is the United Church of Christ General Synod 33. Look for more on these in the newsletter as well.

Lot's of good things are happening here at St. Luke's! And. . . as we come out of the pandemic we are still taking stock of how we have been impacted by this past year and where we stand as a congregation. Sausage Supper 2021

Who says you can't teach old dogs new tricks??? Well, this year of COVID was a bother to some, very troubling for many and even catastrophic for many. For the Sausage Supper Committee that was formed in December, we were filled with enthusiasm and great ideas, but in reality, we didn't have a clue what to expect.

We met at least every two weeks (ZOOM meetings at that. Talk about old dogs and new tricks....) and changed our plans every two weeks. As April 23rd approached the harsh reality set in and we realized inside dining was not an option and plan B was born; all carry outs and deliveries – quite a dramatic change from 83 years of tradition.

The food preparation was a piece of cake as the seasoned pros all stepped up and did their thing without missing a beat. I say this partly in jest as it was a monumental task that they made look easy, but there were a lot of tired old bones at the end of the day. Now we had all this wonderful food, and were staring into the unknown; how do we get it to the hungry masses?

And then what some might say a miracle occurred. Our incredible 20 somethings stepped up and took over the packing, sorting, and compiling hundreds of meals going in all directions at once. I left the kitchen to see if we could get this chaos organized only to find everything humming along like a hive full of bees. Anyone concerned about the future of St. Luke's, just needed to see the next great leaders of our congregation bring their wits, wisdom and certainly vitality to the task.

When we established the budget for Sausage Supper last fall, we were very confident the COVID dilemma would be pretty much passed. Even when we decided to move the date to April and just do deliveries and drive through carry-outs, we were planning on serving about 1,000 meals. Unfortunately, that didn't occur. It may have been our regular customers didn't realize the date change or it could have been several competing events. It certainly didn't help having the surrounding streets under construction. Whatever the cause, we had a ton of food left over including over 400 pounds of sausage. Fortunately, we were able to sell most but more importantly, all of it went to good use.

The bottom line was that we only served 625 meals which is clearly the lowest in memory. Our budget for this year was a very ambitious \$20,825 and our actual total income was only \$13,500. But as I've said numerous times, the income is great and a good measuring stick. However, Sausage Supper is so much more than about the money. The fellowship, dedication, community involvement, and the joy of a job well done mean so much more. So in my humble opinion, after nearly 50 years of helping however I can, I think we hit a home run!

Five years ago, in a thank you note to the congregation I closed with the following: "While this is truly a heartfelt thank you to the many, many members and friends of St. Luke's that make our long standing celebration possible, it is also a pointed reminder that the average age of the core staff responsible for the preparation of the supper is well over 75 years. If we hope to continue to grow, improve and even sustain this memorable tradition, a new generation is going to have to grab the reins. Is it now time for you to step up and be counted?" If we learned nothing else from this year's experience, I believe our fine young folks have shown that they are willing, able and eager to step up to the task. Thanks be to God.
