#### **Pastoral Letter**

Dear Church Family and Friends,

This fall for us at Saint Luke's we are looking forward to some sweet times. In August, as school has resumed, we are celebrating our children with Youth Sunday and Blessing of the Backpacks on August 6. In August worship we will be focusing on our stained glass windows and the teachings that they impart.

In September we will celebrate a month-long homecoming with varied events. Please invite everyone you know to come to church in person and celebrate with us. Look at the Homecoming Invitation in this newsletter for more information.

Also in September, Minister Emily Carle returns to us for nine months as Youth and Young Adult Pastor. During her time with us, Emily will be ensuring Christian Education and monthly youth activities for middle- and high schoolers. She will also resume her Young Adults activities. In her time with us, Emily will be cooperating with other church members to assume leadership roles for youth and young adults. Therefore, when she moves to her next calling, after her seminary graduation in May of 2024, our youth and young adult missions will be on solid footing.

As I write this letter, Japa and I are awaiting his stress test at Norton Hospital Dupont. Yesterday morning he experienced chest pain. After talking with his cardiology nurse, we called 911 when his pain returned and intensified. We were so relieved to find out from EMS and at the hospital that he was not having a heart attack. Thanks be to God for all the professionals who have been treating him (and me) with such care and concern. From first responders-firefighters and EMTs to doctors, nurses, aides of the ER, to the floor nurses, CNAs, hospitalists and cardiologists, respiratory, nuclear medicine, transfer, dietary, and housekeeping folks, I am grateful and amazed to contemplate all the people that are caring for my husband.

As I think of our church family, I think of those that have survived medical crises and those that have not. Believing in the next realm and having had a glimpse of it, I know that on the other side of death, there is something infinitely more wonderful than what we know here. But this life has been given to us to live as fully and lovingly as we can while we are here.

So let us treat each other with as much love and respect as we can muster at any given time. Let us practice forgiveness for ourselves and others when we fall short of acting with lovingkindness. As we participate in St. Luke's fall activities and worship, let us celebrate the sweetness and poignancy of every minute of our God-given lives, praising God and giving glory to the Great I AM in all that we do.

I am grateful to be yours in Christ as I hope for you the knowledge of all peace and grace that flows through the Holy Spirit from our loving God, our Father, our Mother, our Redeemer, our Brother.

#### Pastor's Report on General Synod 34 June 30-July 4, 2023

This year, the Indiana-Kentucky Conference of the United Church of Christ had the honor and the challenge of hosting General Synod 34 (GS34).

Along with planning by national staff, the Conference provided volunteer and staff support to make the Synod happen. Additionally, you as the conference created over 850 prayer shawls and raised over \$79,000.00 to make Synod a success. Our Kyana Association Moderator, Samantha Barrett was a major influence as she co-chaired the local arrangements committee, ensured, through her dad, John, shuttle services for volunteers, and, along with Rev. Ken Rose of St. Marks, provided care and programming for all the 68 UCC youth at Synod.

Every two years (every three years starting in 2025 per the delegates' change of the UCC bylaws) delegates from throughout the United Church of Christ gather to do the work of representing the United Church of Christ to the larger world. Through the passage of resolutions that are brought by churches to the synod for consideration, by amending national bylaws, by receiving reports, and by electing national officers the delegate body represents all of us.

Along with the business of the church, the Synod is enlivened by worship opportunities, by the vendor's area that boasts all kinds of adjunct ministries and support for ministers and ministries, by special meals where different issues pertinent to church life are highlighted, and by the keynote address.

This year's keynote address was delivered by the eloquent Rev. Nadia Bolz-Weber who called us to four areas of discipleship, especially focusing on forgiveness of self and others.

Worship and devotions punctuated each day. Our beloved Emily Carle contributed to the planning process for the morning devotions.

The delegate body considered 2 prudential resolutions and 14 resolutions of witness, passing all but 1 of them after much work to create amendments to the resolutions that would best reflect the overall ethos of the United Church of Christ.

Prudential resolutions establish "policies, institut(e) or revis(e) structure or procedures, and authoriz(e) programs within the wider Church." GS34 passed both prudential resolutions.

Because of United Church of Christ polity, resolutions of witness are not binding on any individual or particular church setting such as local churches, associations, or conferences. Rather, resolutions of witness ask each setting to consider the deliberations and affirmation of the delegate body. Each setting is then asked to consider our covenantal response to the resolutions of witness.

vigorous debate on many of them, the only resolution that failed to pass was the one calling for churches and individuals to move to a plant-based diet. In our weekly emails and future newsletters, I will highlight the resolutions of witness and contemplate how we at St. Luke's might respond to them.

As you review the resolutions, please let me know your response to them. If we have enough people interested, we could even form a response team that could bring recommendations to our council for how we might live into some of these resolutions.

The United Church of Christ continues to be a spearhead for looking at and leading on social justice issues and many of the resolutions reflect that. We at the local church level are challenged by these resolutions to consider our own calling and ability to enact God's call to justice wherever possible. With our move to General Synod happening every three years, it is my hope that our ability to respond will move at a more manageable pace and we can truly live into our UCC covenant and motto—that we may all be one.

Thank you for entrusting to me the responsibility of General Synod 34 witness and participation. I look forward to how the work of GS34 can enliven our congregation in the next two years.
